


Sarum Academy rocked us all!

Virtual Baby Project

Dr Hussain, Curriculum Team Leader for Health and Social Care, has been working with pupils at Sarum Academy on the Virtual Baby project in partnership with Mothers Union and the Diocese of Salisbury. This project has been very successful and pupils have had the opportunity to take virtual babies home for the weekend to experience practical parenting!! Next year, this project will be offered to Year 9 pupils linked in with the topic of sexual health related to the PSHCE syllabus.

Additionally, Dr Hussain was fortunate enough to be awarded £1200 from the Sarum St Michael



Education trust to purchase four sets of the Foetal Alcohol Simulator dolls and the Drug Affected Simulator dolls. These dolls will be used with the Year 12 and 13 pupils studying BTEC Level 3 Health and Social Care. As part of their topic on Human Lifespan Development, pupils learn about FAS and DAS disorders occurring as a result of drinking or taking drugs during pregnancy. Next year, the pupils studying this topic will be able to interact with the FAS and DAS dolls to fully appreciate the impact of pre-natal drinking and alcohol abuse and the impact on the neonate.

Athletics Success – School Games

On a hot and sticky day Sarum pupils from KS3 produced some outstanding displays at the Salisbury games. The day was formatted into four events where each child was tested on their running, jumping and throwing skills.

Sarum dominated from the first event the 300m, with Anton Smith Sharp and Holly Gillies putting in impressive displays. Next it was throwing for the boys and jumping for the girls. All of the Sarum boys threw over 35m and all four boys finished in the podium positions. Josh Paul was the winner of this event with Cameron McCafferty not too far behind him.

In the girls Holly Gillies again produced a strong display to win the standing long jump and then followed this up with another victory in her throwing event.

Josh Paul and Anton Smith Sharp battled to first and second in the jumping event for the boys to make it an enthralling last 100m race.

Holly put in another storming run to see her take Gold overall in the girls category but it was a battle for top spot overall for the boys. Eventually Josh Paul's 300m run earlier in the day saw him crowned overall winner for the boys event ahead of the Avon Valley competitor.

All Sarum athletes in each category have now qualified for the county event in July. Congratulations to all and bring on the next round.



Further Maths



Ione Crossley from the Further Maths Support Programme visited Year 10 pupils this term to deliver a session that demonstrated how GCSE topics can develop through into A Level. The pupils mapped the antics of the Tortoise and Hare story using distance time graphs and then started to consider the shape of the graph on a circular route. The pupils discovered that the Maths required to find the coordinates to plot this graph wasn't as straight forward as they thought and identified the need to use circle formulae and Pythagoras just to get started on the problem. They were also shown the importance of being able to identify Maths 'hidden' in a

task. Mrs Russell was 'very proud of the way the pupils engaged with the problem, they participated enthusiastically and demonstrated a real understanding of the Maths required. A credit to the Maths department.' The pupils found the lesson 'most enjoyable!'
